Organization Description

Our mission is to strengthen US-China relations and to advance sustainable economic growth and environmental protection in both countries.

Position Description: Support the research efforts of the Paulson Institute Climate and Sustainable Urbanization (CSU) program, including research related to policy, economics, technology and market research:

- Conduct fact-based research (both secondary and primary research) in English and Chinese.
- Assist with preparation of high quality written materials using Microsoft PowerPoint, Word, and Excel, including taking the lead on drafting reports or PPTs. This includes both English writing quality and drafting PPTs to the professional format and quality expected in the consulting industry.
- Attend and participate at a high level in meetings with Chinese government, academic and business leaders concerning issues related to climate change, air quality, green finance, conservation, natural capital, and/or natural parks.
- Participate actively in strategic discussions about what topics of research or thoughtleadership could contribute best to achieving the Paulson Institute's mission, as well as shortterm and long-term program objectives.
- Conduct quantitative analysis in Excel or other formats.
- Under the guidance of the Managing Director of Climate and Sustainable Urbanization and Associate Director of Research, work with other team members and program leaders to partner with external organizations and convene activities such as workshops and conferences.
- Lead and conduct in person or phone interviews with Chinese and foreign experts regarding technical, energy and environmental topics.

Position Requirements:

- Chinese native speaker; fluent English
- PRC passport holder
- Minimum 1 year work experience post-graduation
- Graduate in environmental sciences, environmental policy, environmental economics, energy policy, energy economics, finance or related fields.
- Past written research on areas related to energy finance or economics strongly desired.
- Demonstrated interest in policy research—shown through prior writing on policy issues or internships/work with NGOs in this field.
- Depth of qualifications in the following skills:
 - Ability to write English research chapters for major Paulson Institute public reports, as part of a multi-cultural research team.
 - Ability to conduct thorough desktop research on energy, environment and policy topics to answer both simple and complex research questions. Must be able to go beyond highlevel government statements or plans and research reasons and logic behind latest developments in air pollution, economics and environment.



- At meetings with government, academic or business leaders, the applicant should be able to (1) assist team and project leaders in delivering key messages at such meetings,
 (2) ask relevant questions at sufficient depth to reach meaningful conclusions, and (3) help establish close collaborative relationships leading to mutual benefits.
- Successful applicant should not only have a working familiarity with Excel but be able to independently learn and tackle new analytical challenges with Excel or other quantitative software.
- Demonstrated curiosity and drive to improve one's skills beyond the immediate requirements of daily work tasks.
