Position Summary:

As a member of the Climate and Sustainable Urbanization (CSU) program at the Paulson Institute (PI), the Associate Director of Research and Policy will play a key part in developing and carrying out strategic research plans for this program. This role will collaborate across the PI organization as well as with Chinese and international partner organizations to successfully lead research and policy studies from inception to publication. Strong strategic, analytical and relationship building skills are essential for this role.

Responsibilities:

- Work with the Managing Director of CSU to plan, develop and execute research strategy, budgets and logistics to ensure the outcomes of research and policy analysis generate significant impact. Conduct fact-based research with scientific and multi-disciplinary approaches and analytical skills.
- Drawing on informed conclusions, recommend sound policies on climate and sustainable urbanization for central and local governments.
- Assist the Managing Director in fundraising for certain research projects by communicating with international philanthropic foundations.
- Develop and foster relations with Chinese and international research partner organizations..
- Collaborate within PI programs as well as with partner organizations to identify urgent and key research needs.
- Monitor and report dynamic policy or other changes in the fields of climate and sustainable urbanization, and recommend actionable plans to the program and PI.
- Assist in the planning and successful execution of high-level meetings with Chinese government officials, academic, business leaders and NGOs regarding issues related to climate and sustainable urbanization.
- Lead efforts to strategically publicize our convening events, research findings and policy recommendations.
- Play a key role in planning and organizing PI's meetings and conferences on sustainability in partnership with CCIEE.

- At least five years of research experience in at least two fields of climate, energy, urbanization, environment, economics or public policy.
- Advanced knowledge of research methodologies.
- Master's degree and study/work abroad experience preferred.
