Call for Applications: Student Fellowship

MacroPolo is the in-house think tank of the Paulson Institute at the University of Chicago. Our aim is to decode China's economic arrival across its multiple dimensions and to provide insights relevant to policymakers, businesses, journalists, and scholars.

We are seeking Student Fellow(s) to work on a long-term research project on the global supply chain. This project will extend beyond just China, though given its key role in global supply chains, China will figure prominently. The Student Fellow will work closely with the project team to conduct extensive research on relevant industries and specific technologies behind certain products, examining both upstream and downstream industries, as well as specific firms, in the supply chain. The Student Fellow will also have the opportunity to be involved in the product development aspects of the project.

The Student Fellowship program is conducted in partnership with the University of Chicago and is available to applicants who are currently enrolled at either the undergraduate or graduate level. This is a paid position and will require up to 20 hours of work per week, preferably in our downtown office, with flexibility for remote work.

Qualified applicants should have a demonstrable interest in both China and international economics and be comfortable doing both qualitative and quantitative research. Advanced Chinese-language reading capability is highly preferred. Applicants should be able to start the fellowship immediately and commit until Summer 2019.
